ANTICIPATE

3. The government anticipates economic growth next year.

APPRECIATE

1. I really appreciate your help.
Naprawdę doceniam twoją pomoc.
2. We appreciate your honesty.
Doceniamy twoją szczerłość.
3. You'll appreciate this advice later.
Kiedyś docenisz tę radę.

ENCOURAGE

1. My parents always encourage me to follow my dreams.
Moi rodzice zawsze zachęcają mnie, żebym podążał za swoimi marzeniami.
2. The teacher encouraged students to ask questions.
Nauczyciel zachęcał uczniów do zadawania pytań.

3. Good results encourage us to keep working hard.
Dobre wyniki zachęcają nas do dalszej ciężkiej pracy.

DISCOURAGE

OVERLOOK
